The Law Society of South Africa (LSSA) invites attorneys to avail themselves to serve as National Director of Public Prosecutions (NDPP).

As you are aware, the LSSA is one of the seven entities that have been invited by President Cyril Ramaphosa to constitute the NDPP Selection Advisory Panel (the Advisory Panel) to identify and interview suitable candidates to be recommended to the President as the potential NDPP. We have welcomed this new, transparent process.

Should you be interested in the position of NDPP and be of the view that you are a fit and proper attorney, with the relevant experience, conscientiousness and integrity to be entrusted with the role of NDPP; possess the legal qualifications to practise in all the country's courts, are immune to improper influence and able to act without fear, favour or prejudice, please submit the following:

- A 200 word (maximum) motivation outlining your relevant and appropriate experience and expertise.
- A full CV with contact details (please note that you must be a South Africa citizen).

E-mail these to LSSA@LSSA.org.za by 17:00 on Thursday, 25 October 2018.

- An LSSA panel (the LSSA panel) will interrogate all the applications.

- The LSSA panel will request confirmation of good standing from the relevant provincial law society for candidates.

- Candidates selected by the LSSA panel will then be taken forward to the Advisory Panel constituted by the President to follow the formal selection and interview process at that level.

- The selection and interview process will be conducted by the Advisory Panel. We apologise for the short notice, but the LSSA is seeking to facilitate a transparent process which must be finalised by 1 November, in order to take candidate names forward to the President's Advisory Panel by its deadline of 2 November. The Advisory Panel must report to the President by 7 December 2018.
